

Sunday Morning Adult Education

A wonderful series of learning opportunities awaits the adults of the congregation this winter. Steve Davis, professor of Early Christianity at Yale University and a member of our community will introduce us to the childhood of Jesus with a three part series "Childhood Memories." Week One (January 11): Social Memory: Recollections of Childhood (from our own lives to the gospels). Week Two (January 18): Remembering Jesus at Play in the "Infancy Gospel of Thomas." Week Three (January 25): Remembering Jesus at School in the "Infancy Gospel of Thomas." The series will have two main purposes: to get people thinking about their own memories of childhood (how they form and what meaning they have for us) and to introduce people to some of the latest findings in the study of social memory and, to focus on the question of how the early church "remembered" Jesus' childhood, starting with the canonical Gospels and then turning to the so-called Infancy Gospel of Thomas, an early Christian collection of stories about Jesus' younger years.

Paul Chapman will then lead a conversation on Sunday, February 1 and 8, exploring the themes of "Radical Exegesis" and the "Subversive Jesus." These conversations will invite us to study the works of the Jesus Seminar scholars Marcus Borg and Dominic Crossan, William Herzog, and Richard Rohr.

Jen Herbst returns on February 15th for a three-week series. As part of a Robert Wood Johnson Foundation fellowship, Jen Herbst, Associate Professor of Law & Medical Sciences at Quinnipiac University School of Law, has been spent much of this school year looking at the role of the law and lawyers in improving public and community health. Using law as a tool to keep communities healthy is hardly a new idea. A number of the laws we find in the Bible were put in place to promote public health. We'll spend three Sundays looking at some of these Biblical laws and comparing them to our current use of law to support healthy communities, whether in terms of improving food safety and security, providing safe housing, caring for the most vulnerable, preserving the environment, or limiting the spread of contagious diseases. The classes begin at 9:30 a.m. in the Miller Gathering Hall. Coffee and tea are provided.



Afghanistan Memorial Stone

Reclaiming the Prophetic Voice marks the cost of the continuing violence in Iraq and Afghanistan by placing a memorial stone on the Memorial Cairn at the intersection of Broadway, Elm and Park streets in New Haven on the first Monday of each month at 6 p.m. The stone is inscribed with the death toll of US military personnel and the approximate documented numbers of Iraqi and Afghani civilians killed during that same period of time.

The Poverty Simulation: Challenge your Assumptions

The service begins at 7:30 p.m. and will feature Rabbi David Saperstein as guest speaker. Rabbi Saperstein is the newly appointed Ambassador-at-Large for International Religious Freedom, for the United States. Newsweek magazine has called him “the most influential rabbi in the United States. His topic will be “Dr. King’s Message for Today.” All are welcome.

We Made it Back to South Sudan!

It feels good to be back in our home in Yei for a second 3-year term. Much has changed since the start of our first term in 2011 when we arrived at the same doorstep with many bags but no children. Both arrivals, however, included a warm welcome and South Sudanese hospitality. We are so thankful for the opportunity to serve in the place God put in our hearts. **South Sudan has been called "the most illiterate nation in the world."** Building peace and providing formal education will change that statistic. The Presbyterian Church of South Sudan (PCOSS) is asking for support to develop an effective and sustainable education system. The PC(USA) launched a 5-year, \$3.4 million project to join into this effort. Nancy is helping to coordinate the overall project, which works to:

- Train Teachers
- Increase the attendance of girls
- Equip communities to support local schools
- Develop PCOSS' engagement in education
- Build peace so schools can thrive



Memorial Service for Chuck Forman – Sunday, January 18th at 2 p.m.

Friends will gather to remember and give thanks to God for the life of The Rev. Dr. Charles W. Forman on Sunday, January 18th. The service will be held in Marquand Chapel at Yale Divinity School at 2 p.m. Chuck, an active member of the First Presbyterian Church community, died peacefully on Sunday, November 23rd after suffering a heart attack the Friday before. Chuck would have turned 98 on December 2nd. Chuck was a good friend to many, a teacher, a church leader, a man of great compassion and love who is very much missed. Chuck's family hopes that many from First Presbyterian Church will be present to witness to his amazing life. A reception will follow the service in the YDS Common Room.

In Session ...

Highlights from the December Session meeting include the following:

1. It appears that we will finish 2014 in a financially sound position. Stewardship giving is within 0.6% of the pledged amount. Thank you to all of you who made this happen. Also, our annual expenses have been less than expected (hooray!).
2. To date we are within 10% of our 2015 Stewardship budget goal of \$300,000. If you have not pledged yet, it's not too late! Pledge cards are available at the church, or you can contact David Miller (Stewardship Chair).
3. The Session is considering changes to the current committee structure, focusing on new ways of carrying out the work of the church and providing greater opportunity for all congregation members to be involved. Session will be discussing this further in January and will arrange for a congregation wide conversation in January or February. Stay tuned.

This Stewardship season, Session challenged us to increase our funding in two specific areas: Christian Education to support for our new professional Christian Educator, Kimberly Fais. And for Mission, to subsidize a youth group mission trip and for seed money toward transitional housing for the homeless men with Abraham's Tent. The resulting Stewardship goal for 2015 is \$300,000.

Over the past two months, our congregation has responded faithfully pledging a total of nearly \$284,000. This is nearly 95% of our goal. Of the 93 individuals or households who pledged, over one-half dozen are new pledges.

Special Musical Sunday in February

On Sunday, February 15, we at First Presbyterian Church will welcome Christopher Morongiello, a lutenist, for a day of Renaissance and Baroque music. Christopher will play the prelude and postlude in our morning service, and he will give a lute recital in the sanctuary at 3:00 in the afternoon. This is an excellent opportunity to hear a first-rate musician playing an instrument that many of us have rarely seen and heard live.

Christopher Morongiello is a well-known performer of 16th- and 17th-century music, and a leader in the historical performance movement, which promotes the playing of early music on original instruments. He has studied at the Mannes School of Music, the Royal College of Music in London, and Oxford University, where he earned a Ph. D. in musicology. He has played throughout the United States and Europe, both as a solo recitalist and with many early music ensembles. Currently he teaches at Hofstra University on Long Island.
