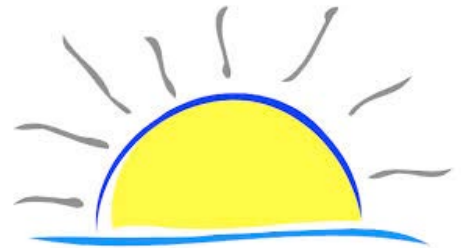

Holy Week and Easter at First Presbyterian Church of New Haven

Holy Week begins on Sunday, March 29th as faithful Christians mark Jesus' entry into Jerusalem and hear again the story of his passion, a story which gives meaning to our lives and to our faith.

The Rev. Thomas Troeger, the J. Edward and Ruth Cox Lantz Professor of Christian Communication at Yale Divinity School, and ordained in the PC(USA) and Episcopal Church, will be our guest preacher that morning. Word, song, story will come to life in a new and exciting way as Professor Troeger tells the Passion story from the perspective of those looking on ... Judas' wife, Caiphas, Pilate, and the crowds, who interestingly enough resemble us. Rachel Daniel will accompany the choir on her cello as together we lift our voices in prayer, making ready for the somber events to come.



Maundy Thursday worship will begin at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, April 2. This service of bread and cup, of forgiveness and reconciliation, of healing and wholeness will take place in the sanctuary. The Sacrament of Holy Communion will be celebrated. All are welcome.

The Good Friday Tenebrae service also begins at 7:30 p.m. in the dimly lit sanctuary. Come and sit with friends and hear again the story of Jesus' passion from the Gospel according to Mark. Move through his betrayal, abandonment, trial, and crucifixion, lifting your voice in song and in prayer, as the sanctuary candles are extinguished and we settle into darkness. Mattie Hatcher Long returns to sing the final solo of the evening, "Were You There." God invites us to return again to Golgotha to hear this story of sorrow and of hope.

Easter Morning arrives at dawn for the annual 6:30 a.m. sunrise service at the summit of East Rock Park. Friends from First and Summerfield UMC and Hamden Plains UMC will join us in proclaiming this good news of great joy! Co-Pastor Bill Goettler will preach the Easter rejoicing sermon. We will sing and we will delight in the rising of the sun and the rising of the Son!

Easter festivities continue with the delicious Easter Breakfast in the Miller Gathering Hall. Tables will be filled with all good things, including strata, muffins, yogurt, fruit and granola. Orange juice and coffee and tea will be served. Come as early as 9:30 a.m. Breakfast will be served until 10:30 a.m.

Easter rejoicing worship begins with a trumpet fanfare at 10:30 a.m. Joshua Gailey returns to accompany our singing, helping us all to declare the wonder of God's amazing power to restore life after death. Easter flowers will fill the sanctuary providing a much longed for sign of spring. Co-Pastor Maria LaSala will deliver the Easter sermon. The children of the congregation will remain in worship for the entire service. Activity packets for children of all ages will be available from the ushers. The Sacrament of Holy Communion will be celebrated so we can taste and see the goodness of God.

Christ is Risen, Christ is Risen Indeed! May God bless you and those you love this Eastertide season.

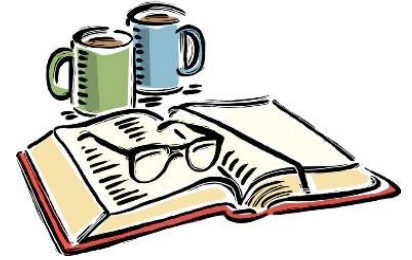

On Easter Sunday, Joshua Gailey, our trumpeter from last Easter, will join us again for both prelude music and accompaniment to the hymns during the service. The choir will sing two contemporary Easter anthems, "Christ the Lord Is Risen" and "Light of the Minds That Know Him," and the choir and congregation will again join together in singing Handel's "Hallelujah" from the *Messiah* at the end of the service.

On April 12, the Sunday after Easter, First Presbyterian Church of New Haven proudly presents an afternoon recital of exquisite music by virtuoso lutenist Christopher Morrongiello at 3 p.m. A graduate of the Mannes College of Music and University of Oxford and a recipient of the prestigious British Marshall Scholarship, Dr. Morrongiello has been actively promoting the lute and its repertoire in concerts, recordings, and academic journals for more than twenty years. He has performed for HRM Queen of England and was a prizewinner in the BBC Radio Two Young Musician of the Year Competition. His recital will be played on an authentic gut-strung Renaissance lute. During the performance he will give an account of this beautiful instrument's fascinating history, cultural significance, and playing technique. Do join us for what promises to be a splendid, memorable event!

Children in Worship

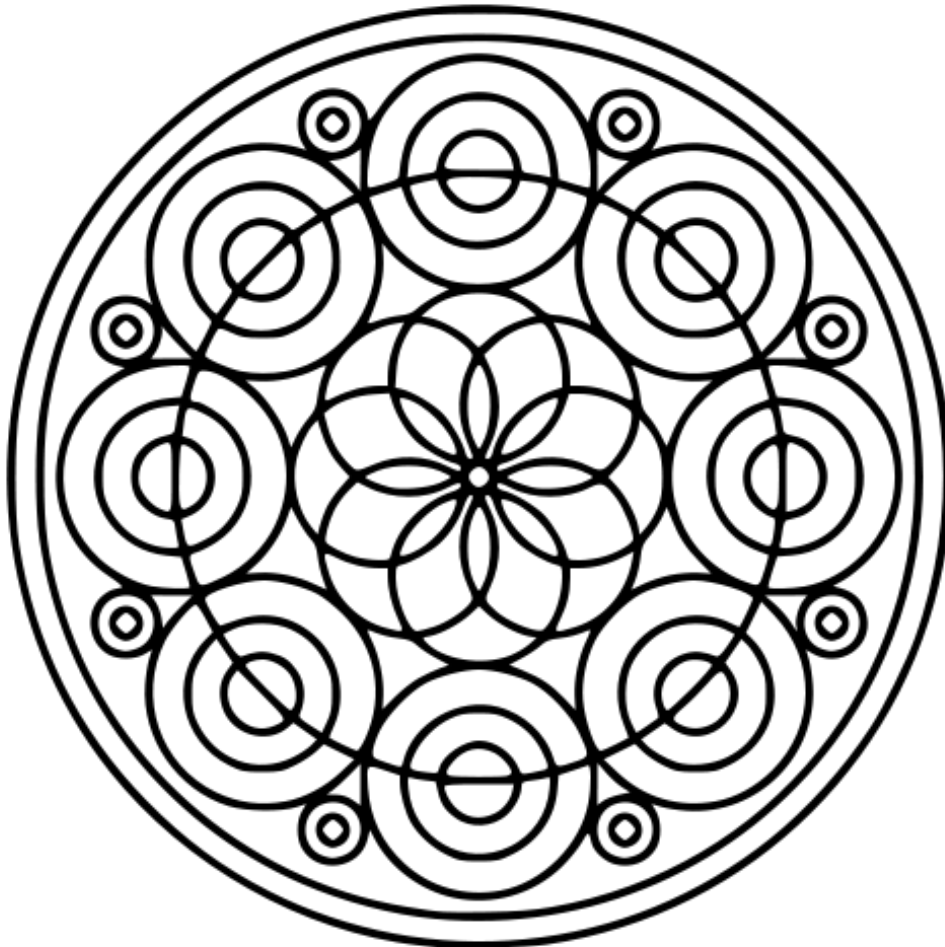
In March, our Children in Worship shared something important to them with the congregation: the spirituality of coloring! We included a mandala in the bulletins and the kids distributed crayons to everyone. Here's what they want you to know!

This Lent, we tried different spiritual practices. Molly and Becca taught us a body prayer that their class does in Sunday school. There's a pose for each line of the prayer. Kimberley showed us how to be mindful of our breathing. We breathed in God's goodness and we breathed out fear, sadness, and anger.

But our favorite spiritual practice is the one that came most naturally to us: coloring! Did you know coloring is a spiritual practice for people of all ages?

Coloring can improve focus, reduce stress and anxiety, and provide a means of self-expression beyond words. Mandalas are particularly good for meditation because symmetry and repetition center the mind and spirit. Many Christians and people of traditions around the world design and color mandalas. We included one in Sunday's bulletin for people to color during worship and take home with them. For anyone who missed it or who wants to make another one, we'll include it here in the Inkling, too.

So go ahead and color. Not that you need it, but you have our permission!

The Session met on March 17th

1. Following prayer and devotions by Elder Jane Hindenlang, the Session welcomed and received new member Kathleen Ang. The Session also received on Sunday, March 22 the following new members: Cassy and Forrest Gulden, Marcia and Adam Mecca, Chamilla Justesen, and Kevin Brown and Ronnye Rutledge.

2. Financial report (Elder Jim Duncan) - Results for the month were close to budget.

3. Christopher McCloskey attended to ask the Session to move him from Inquirer to Candidate in his process toward ordination. After discussion and questioning, the Session gave its approval unanimously. Elder Nancy Woodington will serve as Christopher's liaison to the Session.

4. Committee News:

A Visit from Robin McHaelen of True Colors

Robin McHaelen, Executive Director of *True Colors* is coming to New Haven to meet with clergy and youth leaders in our area to talk with us about the ways *True Colors* works with LGBTQ young people, engaging them in issues that matter most to LGBTQ youth. *True Colors, Inc.*, is a non-profit organization that works with other social service agencies, schools, organizations, and communities to ensure that the needs of sexual and gender minority youth are recognized and addressed in fair and just ways.

The event will be held on **Wednesday, April 29th from noon until 2 p.m. in the Owens Community Building at the First Presbyterian Church of New Haven, 704 Whitney Avenue, New Haven, CT.** Lunch will be provided by Presbyterian Promise, the Presbyterian Church USA's organization working for the full inclusion of LGBTQ people in the Presbyterian Church.

The clergy and youth leaders will talk with Robin about how *True Colors* might assist congregation's youth leaders and clergy to learn more about LGBTQ young people and their needs, and how congregations can play a positive role in our youth's development. The youth we love, care for, and serve need us to have this conversation.

From Our YDS Intern:

What I Did Over Spring Break--During the first week of the spring break, I traveled to New York City on behalf of the denomination to the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (CSW). I have served as the part-time, deployed field staff for Women's Ministries for over five years. Each of those years, Women's Ministries has sent a delegation of young women to serve as representatives for the PC(USA) within the UN NGO community. Our delegation of young women work along side with representatives from Presbyterian Women and staff from the Presbyterian Ministry at the United Nations. Collectively, we also work with our ecumenical partners advocating on behalf of women and girls. This year's theme for CSW was to review our gains achieved and struggles toward global gender equality since the creation of the Beijing Platform for Action, the outcome document of the Fourth World Conference for Women in the 1995. While at the commission, we heard panel presentations, took part in intergeneration dialogues, worshipped with ecumenical partners, and marched with women and men from around the world on International Women's Day. Additionally, we also advocated about the issues of violence and discrimination against women, poverty reduction, climate change, education for women and girls, and reproductive health. Ecumenical Advocacy Days to Focus on Mass Incarceration

Come to Washington, DC, April 17-20, 2015, for the 13th Annual National Gathering of Ecumenical Advocacy Days for Global Peace with Justice titled, *"Breaking the Chains: Mass Incarceration and Systems of Exploitation."*

Join over 1,000 Christian advocates in building a movement to shake the foundations of systems of human exploitation (Acts 16:16-40), including a prison-industrial system that incarcerates millions of people in the U.S. and abroad. A world that incarcerates so many and allows some to profit from the exploitation of slave, trafficked and forced labor remains far from the "beloved community" which we are all called to seek.

The U.S. makes up only five percent of the world's population yet holds nearly a quarter of the world's prisoners. Still, "imprisonment" is a worldwide problem and takes various forms, as everywhere people around the world remain trapped in detention centers, prisons, factories and drug wars that bind and dehumanize individuals for political or economic profit.

As people of faith, we denounce the elements in our world that justify such systems of exploitation and mass incarceration. At EAD, we will confess our personal and corporate failure to break the chains of poverty, racism, and greed institutionalized in our laws, economy, and social behaviors that collude to perpetuate such human exploitation and strip civil and human rights.

As people of Hope, we are reminded that Jesus' radical message was one of liberation for all and restoration of right relationships. Through prayer, worship, advocacy training, networking and mobilization with other Christians, we will face the reality of mass incarceration and corporate exploitation, and call for national policies that bring liberation both to the prisoner and to a world in need of restoration – all culminating with EAD's Congressional Lobby Day on Capitol Hill.

The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) is proud to sponsor and collaborate in planning this conference that seeks to build a movement to shake the foundations of systems of exploitation (Acts 16). We further invite you to arrive early and attend "Compassion, Peace and Justice Training Day," an opportunity for Presbyterians to gather, reflect, educate, network, fellowship, and be in prayer together.
