Sunday 12/6: After worship and the church meeting, those in Youth Group and Children in Worship will team up to **host a Friendship Hour of refreshments and fun** for the whole congregation. Our Library Team will be on-hand to assist in the voting process for our newest library resources, and our Dance Leaders will play music in an adjacent room and supervise activities in movement and dance. Sunday 1/17: After worship, we will **make fleece blankets to donate to New Haven's IRIS, Integrated Refugee & Immigrant Services**. Last year we made four blankets for new families in our community. How many will we make this time? Our crafty Candice will lead this mission project, open to all interested youth ages 11-18. A light lunch will be provided. Let us know of any allergies or dietary restrictions.

What's New With Presbyterian Promise?

In the words of Elder Ralph Jones :

“Ordination obstacles – removed.

Marriage prohibition – eliminated.

Same gender marriage – legal in all states.

What next?”

What next is a hot topic for Presbyterian Promise an educational and advocacy group, which seeks to broaden the welcome of gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgendered people in the life of the church. FPC New Haven has been a longtime supporter of Presbyterian Promise's work, along with six other congregations in the Presbytery and individual donors.

We can celebrate the changes that have taken place, but we know that there is still work to be done. Among other things this year, Presbyterian Promise:

- Partnered with the Rev. Maria LaSala and First Presbyterian Church to invite Robin McHaelan, Executive Director of True Colors, to speak to an interfaith group of ministers and rabbis on the needs, challenges and gifts of LGBTQ+ youth in CT. The dialogue continues with LGBTQ+ youth in the New Haven area.
- Provided support and partnered with others in the Presbytery in two banner making workshops led by Grace Cox-Johnson, a liturgical fiber artist and musician from Kansas City.
- Provided visible welcoming Christian outreach at Pride festivals in Fairfield County, Providence, Rhode Island, and Hartford.

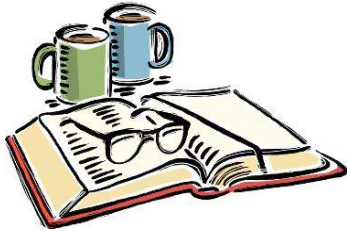
